SIGNATURE KEYNOTES & WORKSHOPS

MODULE 1: THE ARCHITECTURE OF BELONGING

Focus: Professional Identity, Bias, and Cultural Competence

This session deconstructs the question "Where are you from?" not as a microaggression, but as a portal into identity and power.

- **The Shift:** Moving from "fitting in" (erasure) to "belonging" (presence).
- **The Tool:** "Narrative Anchoring" techniques to remain grounded in adversarial settings.
- **The Outcome:** Strategies for claiming professional identity without severing cultural roots.

MODULE 2: NARRATIVE DIGNITY & TRAUMA-INFORMED ADVOCACY

Focus: Client Ethics, Interviewing, and Moral Imagination

Advocacy often involves extracting stories from trauma. This module introduces the ethical obligation to hold a story with reverence rather than just utility.

- **The Distinction:** "Extracting a timeline" vs. "Honoring a narrative."
- **The Warning Signs:** Identifying vicarious trauma and burnout in justice work.
- **The Practice:** Leading with moral imagination to prevent re-traumatization.

MODULE 3: LEADERSHIP AS DISRUPTION (HEYOKA FIRE)

Focus: Systems Change, Conflict Resolution, and Adaptive Leadership

True cultural sustainability requires leaders who can disrupt without destroying. Drawing on the "Heyoka" framework, we explore the role of the contrarian.

- **Reframe Conflict:** Viewing tension as an information source, not a liability.
- **The Disruptor:** How to challenge policy effectively and safely.
- **Sustainability:** Creating a long-term plan for a career in advocacy.
